CIE/USA-Seattle and the Internship

CIE/USA-Seattle collaborates with former City of Bellevue Mayor Conrad Lee to develop a youth leadership program – the Mayor Lee Internship.

The Mayor Lee Internship provides opportunities to learn and practice civic engagement, develop expertise in leadership, and enhance their communication skills to become future leaders in public services, government, and STEM fields.

The internship program is centered around the idea of “Civic Engagement through Philanthropy and Education”. The internship includes brainstorming community project ideas and bringing those projects to life. The internship is a two-year with minimal expectation of 8 hours a week, and comes with an expectation of strong parental support and engagement.
